Dear families,

Next half term, Year 6 Pullman will continue to explore World War II in their History lessons. We will focus on the Home Front and how Sheffield was affected by the conflict. To learn more about this period, we will be visiting the Emergency Services Museum. During this visit, we will discover how Sheffield's steel industry made it a target for German bombing, the effects of raids on the city and how the emergency services coped with help from the civilian population. We will come face to face with an incendiary bomb and handle a range of original artefacts to discover how Britain played its part in defeating the Nazi menace. It will be a great opportunity to learn about our great city's past in a different environment.

This trip will take place on **Thursday 16th January** during the school day. We will travel on the bus into the city centre and walk the short distance to the Museum. Returning to school, we will catch the train from Sheffield station to Dore station and then walk back up to Totley Primary. We are due to arrive back at school around 3 pm. The bus is scheduled to depart at 8:56 am so **please ensure your child is in school by 8:30 am to facilitate a prompt departure from TPS.**

Your child will need a packed lunch and a still drink in a secure, non-glass container. All of this will need to be contained in a bag that your child is able to carry easily. **If your child is in receipt of free school meals, we will provide a grab bag. However, you will still need to provide a drink for your child.** Because we are leaving school grounds, please wear a school uniform, and a coat, as some parts of the day are outside.

For these opportunities, there is cost involved, and therefore a voluntary contribution is requested. We have finalised this with the Trust finance team and the total cost is £10.36. Paying for the trip and giving permission can be done via Parent Pay, which will be available this afternoon.
